Mr. Harry Saroop appeared before Committee with respect to his noise exemption request for 361 Wildgrass Road. He explained that he had applied for a noise exemption for to accommodate a wedding. Mr. Saroop described the event, and outlined specifically when he would require an exemption. He noted that he had circulated his request to his neighbours, and to date there had been no objections received.

Councillor Nando Iannicca enquired about the noise exemption request procedure. Mr. Jamie Hinton, Manager of Compliance and Licensing Enforcement advised that the applicant of a noise exemption request must either publish a notice in the local paper or mail a notice to residents within a 500 metre radius, that outlines the proposed event and when the exemption will be considered by General Committee.

7. Our Future Mississauga: Community Engagement and Directions Report

Corporate Report dated June 3, 2008 from the City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer with respect to the Our Future Mississauga: Community Engagement and Directions Report.

Mr. Bruce Carr, Director, Strategic Planning & Business Service and Ms. Jennifer Keesmaat, Partner, Office for Urbanism appeared before Committee with respect to the Our Future Mississauga Engagement and Directions Report. Mr. Carr provided an overview of the community engagement process which began with 110 community group meetings, numerous presentations to over 1, 900 students, and over 200 invitations sent to community representatives, seeking their involvement in stakeholder meetings and interviews. Out of the 200 invitations over 70 people had attended the meetings, and 16 volunteered their time to be part of the Community Advisory Group. He advised of the Speakers Series, which featured sessions with urban experts and other leading thinkers, which attracted over 3000 attendees, and a three-part Rogers Television program that focused on the issues faced by the City. Mr. Carr advised of the visioning portion, which consisted of a two day public Visioning Symposium that attracted over 500 participants, and generated over 5000 ideas.

Ms. Keesmaat advised that the document entitled, Community Engagement and Directions Report had been formulated based on the input gained at the various public consultation sessions, and that the report yields 18 drivers for change. She explained that

the 18 drivers, identify opportunities, internal challenges, and external forces that the City must respond to while planning for the future. Ms. Keesmaat advised that once the 18 drivers were established, the “Making it Real Workshop” was held on April 3, 2008. At the workshop the drivers were further refined to create five strategic pillars. Ms. Keesmaat listed the established strategic pillars as the following; developing a transit oriented city, ensuring youth and older adults and new immigrants thrive, completing out neighbourhoods, cultivating creative and innovative businesses, and finally living green. She indicated that these strategic pillars can be viewed as components needed for a great City.

Mr. Carr demonstrated how each step of the process lead into another, and that it will ultimately produce a new strategic plan, and an implementation plan. He pointed out that the Report before Committee, chronicles the engagement process and its findings. Mr. Carr advised of an upcoming meeting on June 24, 2008, slated as an open house to gain further public comment.

Councillor Nando Iannicca moved approval of the recommendation in the subject Corporate Report. The motion was voted on and carried.

8. Draft Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga in the 21st Century
Corporate Report dated June 3, 2008 from the City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer with respect to the draft strategic plan for the City of Mississauga in the 21st Century.

RECOMMENDATION

That the report dated June 3, 2008 entitled, “Draft Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga in the 21st Century” from the City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer be received and that staff be directed to consult with the public and report back to Council.

Mr. Bruce Carr, Director, Strategic Planning & Business Service and Ms. Jennifer Keesmaat, Partner, Office for Urbanism appeared before Committee with respect to the Draft Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga in the 21st Century. Mr. Carr gave an outline of the evolution of Mississauga, noting key historic events, and population increases. Mr. Carr advised that the current strategic plan has been in place since 1999, and that it did not seek public consultation. Mr. Carr described the five strategic pillars, as listed in the Community Engagement and Directions Report; he noted their distinct, principles and the rationale for choosing them as components of a great city.

Councillor Iannicca expressed concern about the engagement process as outlined in the

Community Engagement and Directions Report. He advised that now is the time for action. He suggested that Mississauga develop great public spaces to attract and engage the public and noted several successful public spaces within the City, including Hurontario Street and Lakeshore Road. Councillor Iannicca suggested that to further promote public spaces Burnhamthorpe Road have its lanes reduced, and that the Civic Square be redeveloped to be more people friendly.

Councillor Frank Dale expressed support for Councillor Iannicca's comments. He explained that Mississauga is the 6th largest City in Canada and that the City is currently experiencing an urbanization phase. He identified several areas within the City currently experiencing urbanization. Councillor Dale commented on the importance of having youth involved in the process and complimented staff for ensuring that their voices were heard.

Councillor Maja Prentice commented that there are areas or categories that the City of Mississauga is currently exceeding and that these should not be overlooked. She enquired on the future costs associated with meeting the recommendations formulated from the engagement process and expressed concern about achieving these goals in a fiscal matter. She advised of some capital projects that have been in process for many years, and may conflict with the ideas outlined in the Community Engagement and Directions Report. Ms. Janice Baker, City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer advised that the reports reflect a long term vision. She reflected on the difference between ideas from a visioning session and how they become incorporated into plans, she explained the function of a capital budget.

Councillor Pat Mullin expressed support for facilitating some of the ideas from the engagement sessions immediately. She suggested that staff should actively pursue smaller recommendations, that will not constrain finances. Councillor Parrish indicated that the report did not suggest the development of a museum or art gallery and that it should become a priority for the City. Councillor Parrish advised that the fastest growing group in Peel is the working poor, and that it may have been difficult for these individuals to attend the sessions. She reflected on the nature of development within the City core, and commented on its potential direction.

Ms. Keesmaat advised that there is a risk of having initiatives which conflict with the City's fundamental orientation, for example any potential street widenings. She noted the example of the City of Vancouver, and that they had implemented creative planning policies in order to maintain their guiding principles.

Mayor Hazel McCallion reflected on the brief history of Mississauga and that because it is a relatively young it cannot be compared to cities such as Winnipeg, Calgary, or Vancouver. She described past endeavours made by City Council to develop the City core and noted that intensification in the right areas is necessary. Mayor McCallion advised that in future City Council might require borrowing funds to help further develop the City core. She reflected on past and potential capital projects and advised that the costs

involved are not only in its construction, but also in its upkeep.

Councillor Adams commented on the findings of the engagement process. She suggested developing future partnerships with corporations to help fund the arts and support community events. Councillor Adams emphasized the importance of the connectivity of Mississauga's neighbourhoods and neighbours.

Mr. W. J. Chickley, Vice President and General Manager, Pitney Bowes Canada, Community Advisory Group Member appeared before Committee with respect to the Draft Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga. Mr. Chickley gave a brief overview of his involvement in the citizen engagement process. He stressed the importance of attracting talented professionals, to the community and providing opportunities for skilled immigrants. He recommended that the strategic plan should become the foundation on which all other policy would build upon. He identified the development of the arts and creating an environmentally friendly City as key priorities for the future. Mayor McCallion thanked Mr. Chickley for attending and submitting his comments on the Draft Strategic Plan. She reflected on the need for gaining greater support from the corporations within Mississauga.

Mr. Frank Giannone, President of FRAM Building Group, Community Advisory Group Member appeared before Committee with respect to the Draft Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga. Mr. Giannone noted the importance of developing transit in the City, and suggested developing a form of rapid transit, maximizing on geographic coordinors. He commented on the strategic pillar of completing neighbourhoods, and expressed an interest in working with the City of Mississauga to achieve this goal.

Ms. Shila Heeralall, resident, appeared before Committee with respect to the Draft Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga. Ms. Heeralall advised that the Draft Strategic plan should discuss the promotion of social issues at the local level. She expressed concern about the current state of the social issues, and that in future they may further deteriorate. In response Mr. Carr noted that issues of social concern have been included throughout each pillar. Mayor McCallion suggested that the deputant, meet with staff to further discuss her concerns and obtain information.

Councillor Prentice thanked the deputant for sharing her ideas. Councillor Prentice noted that if Ms. Heeralall had any future concerns she is most welcome to contact her Ward office but noted that social concerns should also be voiced at the Regional level.

Councillor Nando Iannicca moved approval of the recommendation in the subject Corporate Report. The motion was voted on and carried.

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Corporate Report dated May 23, 2008 from the Commissioner of Corporate Services with respect to Consent to Enter Agreements for Enersource Hydro Mississauga Inc. and Rogers Communications Inc. relating to the relocation of their utility plants required in connection with the Region of Peel Herridge Feedermain Project.

RECOMMENDATION
